Ballad – A form of folk literature, they were passed down from generation to generation verbally. It's a form of verse to be sung or recited. It is and characterized by its presentation of a dramatic or exciting episode in simple narrative form.

Ballads come from oral tradition, so no strict rules dictate their form. However a number of characteristics are associated with ballads. Every ballad contains some of these elements: **supernatural elements**; **sensational, sordid, or tragic subject matter**; a **refrain**; and the **omission of details**.

- 1. Incremental repetition used to build suspense. A phrase or sentence is repeated with a new element added each time until the climax is reached.
- 2. A question and answer format the facts of the story are revealed little by little from the answers. This builds suspense.
- 3. Conventional patterns understood by listeners to have meaning beyond their literal eons.
- 4. A strong, simple beat ballads were sung for the general audience; therefore, the rhyme and meter was simple.
