Remember it is a means of propaganda employed by the Inner Party to encourage conformity and public support of Party actions and policies. Be true to the novel.	Using the five propaganda techniques generally used in advertisements (list found in ppt on teacher's website) and Prezi, give definition and examples of each. Give one specific example from the novel for each propaganda technique. Write a detailed explanation that proves the example is this type of explanation.	Explain the meaning or symbolism of at least <i>eight</i> character's names from <i>Anthem</i> . Why do you think Rand chose the names that she did? How do they add meaning to the story? Create a detailed chart or display using a word processor, Prezi, or some other digital media.	Some novels and plays seem to advocate changes in social or political attitudes or in traditions. Using <i>Anthem</i> or <i>1984</i> briefly note the particular attitudes or traditions that the author apparently wishes to modify. Then analyze the techniques the author uses to influence the reader's or audience's views. Avoid plot summary.
Compare/contrast Julia and Winston's idea of the Party and what rebellion means to each of them. Put your findings in a Prezi.	Using a word processor, write a letter from Equality to Liberty in which he explains how he is feeling about her and his situation. Equality has just seen Liberty and does not know her name yet. Make sure to use the same language that Equality would usewe. Letter should be two to three paragraphs.	Create a six panel brochure that lists and describes the three main social classes in 1984. Use color, pictures, and be creative. Decorate all panels, and fill all space. Include all relevant information. Use Prezi, Glogster, Pic Collage, or some other digital media.	In 1984, identify a character who conforms outwardly while questioning inwardly. Then write an essay in which you analyze how this tension between outward conformity and inward questioning contributes to the meaning of the work. Avoid mere plot summary.
Using Prezi, place the occupations or roles in Anthem's society in order of importance from the least to most. Include a detailed description of their duties and which of the characters fit under these categories. Explain why you ranked them in the order you chose.	How would you feel if you lived in a society like Equality's? What would you do if you were in his situation? Using a word processor, write <i>three</i> diary entries as if you were living in his society. Include dates from the story's time period. Write in the style of character from the novel. Each entry should be a paragraph long.	In Prezi form, compare and contrast the two societies of 1984 and Anthem. Also compare other 2 other types of societies with Anthem (i.e. Communism, Democracy, Monarchy, etc) Compare gender roles, laws, customs, and more.	In some works of literature, a character who appears briefly, or does not appear at all, is a significant presence. Using <i>Anthem</i> or 1984 write an essay in which you show how such a character functions in the work. You may wish to discuss how the character affects action, theme, or the development of other characters. Avoid plot summary
