2nd Book Talk Assignment L. Douglas

British Literature and 10th Grade Honors/Gifted

You should recently have finished or will soon finish an outside reading book for this class. You will now **prepare** a **3-5 minute** oral presentation on your book to present to the class. Your presentation should include the following:

- An **introduction** stating the title of the book, author, and genre (explain why it is part of this genre). Your introduction should be interesting, compelling, designed to capture our interest; it should hook the audience– just as the introduction of an essay does. Bring the book to class with you. *This should be about 30 seconds.*
- A brief, but detailed **summary** of the book, which does NOT give away the ending or other important surprise/suspense elements if your book has them. Include at least three parts of the book that support what you say about the plot. Include main characters and short descriptions. Give a sense of what the book is about, but do not ruin it for the audience. *This should take* **between 30 seconds and 1** *minute.*
- A direct statement of your **opinion** of the book, along with **at least two supportive reasons** for your opinion. *This should take 30 seconds to 1 minute.*
- An intelligent description of the **author's style** or a key aspect of his/her style (such as use of symbol, dialect, etc.). You will select a short passage to read that is a good example of the stylistic element(s) you plan to discuss, and then you will discuss those elements and their impact on the reader and the author's purpose. *This should take 1-2 minutes.*

You may have handwritten notes with you, but you may not read your presentation to the class.

Updated requirement: Using a book talk sticky note, please rate your book (? out of 5), and write a one sentence summary to place in the back of the book.
