I can communicate and collaborate with my book club group in order to deepen my understanding of my chosen tales.

Goals: to encourage thinking about the ideas in these tales and to broaden understanding of themes and the development of characters by discussing these tales with others; to participate in a community book club where we learn from the perspective of others.

In each class, groups of **3-6 people** are going to form a book club based on their interests. Throughout a few weeks, we will read our tales independently and consider these questions:

What do different people value? What can we learn from the stories of other people? How can the stories of other people help us understand other perspectives?

Read all of the pages assigned each week before your Book Club meets.

Bring your completed "Track Thinking" handouts for each tale on the required days.

Each group will be assigned a selection of readings from *The Canterbury Tales*.
